INTERVIEW WITH THE LANGUAGE ASSISTANT

Where were you born?

- I was born in Scotland but I have been in living in New Zealand for fourteen years.

If you were born in Europe, why did you leave to go to New Zealand?

- So, when I was sixteen my father found a job in New Zealand and my parents asked me if I wanted to go with them or stay in Scotland and I decided to go with them to discover a new country and a new culture.

Do you have both Nationalities? -

Yes, I do now. I have both: my British passport and my New Zealand passport.

What were your motivations to become an Assistant?

- I've worked in teaching for the last five or six years. I've worked in private schools while I studied and I wanted to work in the public sector and also leave New Zealand and gain some experience overseas, especially in a French speaking country.

What did you study at university?

- I did my (licence) in French and Spanish. Then I took one year in French translation and I did my masters in French literature.

Did you have an assistant in high school? -

We did. When I moved to New Zealand I had two years of high school there, we had two assistants. One male assistant from Corsica and another female assistant who came from Grenoble.

Was it helpful?

-Yes, I found very helpful and I enjoyed learning languages and although my teachers could speak French very well. It is always interesting to meet and to speak with people who come from a different country and who are native speakers of that language.

It's your second year here, why did you come back?

- So, I was at Lycée Antoine Kéla last year and I really fell in love with Poindimié. I had an excellent year working with my fellow English colleagues and also working with the students. And at the end of last year I wrote a letter to the Vice Rectorat and pleaded with them to let me come back for another so that I could continue working with the student and finish some of the project that I started last year.

What are you going to do after? - So, after this year I would love to stay in New Caledonia whether that be an English assistant here at the Lycée or be at the university or perhaps working for a private school or a private company. I would really like to stay however it all depends if there are job opportunities here. Or I would think about going to France to work in a university there and perhaps in three or four years' time I will start working on my doctorat in French or comparative literature.
